	<p>Imagery, a figure of speech in which one thing is said to <u>be</u> another thing.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: _____</p>
	<p>An exaggerated figure of speech.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: _____</p>
	<p>A figure of speech which seems to contradict itself, not make sense, be its own opposite; a compressed paradox.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: _____</p>
	<p>A figure of speech using the name of one thing or one part of something to represent something larger or related.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: _____</p>
	<p>(1) Representing, embodying, or being a strong or typical example.</p> <p>(2) Giving human characteristics or features to animals, objects, abstract ideas, etc. To consider non-human things as being human.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: _____</p>
	<p>A saying or expression whose meaning is not literally the same as the words; usually figurative, informal, colloquial.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: _____</p>
	<p>A likeness or similarity between two things, people or situations; which are compared with each other to make a point, explain, persuade or argue.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: _____</p>
