	The name of a person, animal, place or thing, or a feeling, idea or quality.
	Words that tell you what people, animals or things <i>are, do, have, say, feel, think</i> .
	A word which describes and adds interesting details to a noun.
	A word that describes or modifies and adds interesting details to a verb or adjective.
	A word which can be used instead of a noun when the noun has already been stated. (So you don't need to repeat the noun.)
	A word that comes before and tells about a noun, or adjective + noun: <i>the, a, an</i> .
	A word which joins other words or groups of words.



Word Classes (2)

	A word which connects, joins, or links different ideas, by joining sentences and paragraphs.
	A special type of adjective, eg. <i>this, many, which, my</i> .
	A verb (ending in <i>-ing</i>) that acts as a noun.
	One or more words joined with a noun, eg. <i>the house; such an exciting movie about her life</i> .
	A preposition plus a noun, noun group or pronoun, eg. <i>in my bag, in the early morning, from them</i> .
	A verb, plus an adverb or preposition which changes the meaning of the verb, eg. <i>breakup, breakthrough</i> .
	A two-part verb, where one word modifies the main part of the verb, to show what is necessary or possible; eg. <i>will go, must, should, or won't go</i> .
